Course Description:

This course promotes the study and performance of contemporary works written for orchestral percussion instruments, while focusing on technique development, musicality and expression, tone production, and performance presence. It also addresses vernacular traditions such as Afro-Cuban drumming, Caribbean steel drums, and hand drums.

Course Goals:

- 1. Develop an understanding and mastery of advanced percussion techniques and concepts on a range of western and non-western percussion instruments.
- 2. Improve and heighten chamber music performance techniques.
- 3. Improve understanding of rhythm, pitch dynamics, phrasing and musical touch.
- 4. Develop an understanding of the range of percussion repertoire in various styles from the early 20th century to the present.

Attendance:

Students are expected to be at every rehearsal, in which they are involved. Unexcused absences are not allowed, and therefore will result in **lowering of the students' final grade by one letter grade (A becomes B, etc.)**. Students must inform Dr. King of any absence from percussion ensemble rehearsal with <u>24-hour notice</u>.

If the Percussion Ensemble is rehearsing a piece that you are not performing in, it is expected that you are in the building practicing/rehearsing your Percussion Ensemble repertoire during rehearsal time, unless otherwise cleared by Dr. King.

Personal Practice and Development of Musical Skills:

All students are required to practice <u>AT MINIMUM</u> the number of hours they are registered for (i.e. 2 credit hours=2 practice hours per day (ideally 2-4 hours per day).

Two-Hour Practice Session Formula:

First thirty-minutes=warmup and develop technique Second thirty-minutes=practice developing sight-reading skills Last hour=practice solo and/or chamber literature that is currently being prepared.

Sectionals:

During the semester, students are REQUIRED to schedule an <u>hour sectional each week</u> for each piece they are on. For example, if you are performing in two pieces, you and your ensemble members are required to rehearse two hours (minimum) each week outside of Tuesday/Thursday rehearsals; one hour per piece.

E-mail:

The instructor will use the **REINHARDT email system** for contacting students outside of class. Each student is required to check their email daily so that they do not miss any important announcements from the instructor. The instructor is not responsible for information that is missed because a student failed to check their email daily.

Assignments:

Students are expected to come prepared to all rehearsals with NOTES LEARNED. **ALL STUDENTS** are expected to prepare the repertoire that is being performed for the term concert. Students are expected to show up rehearsal early to move equipment and have instrumentation set up ahead of downbeat so rehearsal can start at 6:00pm.
